Active and Passive Voice

A verb in the **active voice** puts the focus on the subject, the doer of the action. A verb in the **passive voice** tells what was done to or what happened to the subject. The doer of the action becomes not as important as the receiver of the action.

Example: The players notice a tall visitor. (Active)

A tall visitor is noticed by the players. (Passive)
