Types of Appositives

An **appositive** is a noun or pronoun placed next to a noun or pronoun to identify it. There are two types of appositives:

Type 1: A **restrictive appositive** defines a noun so the sentence is easier to understand.

Type 2: A **nonrestrictive appositive** is not necessary to understand the sentence.
