Types of Conflicts

There are four main types of conflicts in literature:

Person vs. Person: in this type of story, there is a clear protagonist and a clear antagonist. Stories with hero and a villain fall into this category.

Person vs. Self: In this type of story, the protagonist is struggling with something within themselves.

Person vs. Nature: In this type of story, the antagonist is nature (ie. Climate change, being lost at sea. etc.)

Person vs. Society: In this type of story, the antagonist is society (i.e., social expectations, technology. etc.)
