Point of View

Point of view refers to the perspective that the narrator holds in relation to the events of the story. Three primary points of view are:

First person: The narrator tells a story from their own perspective ("I went to the store");

Second person: The narrator tells a story about you, the reader or viewer ("You went to the store");

Third person: The narrator tells a story about other people ("He went to the store").
