Consonant Digraphs

Consonant Digraphs refers to two consonants that **work together to make one unique sound**. The individual sounds of the letters are not heard; instead, they create a new sound.

Example:

In the word *chip*, ch puts the letters c and h together to make the /ch/ sound.
