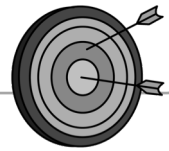

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Idioms and Expressions

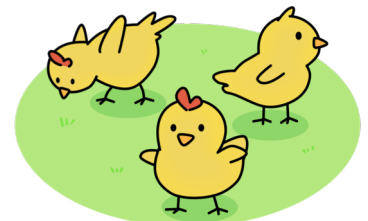
Idioms and **expressions** are colorful ways to say something. The words that make up an idiom mean something different from what they mean by themselves.

 - D. Something happens in a big hurry.

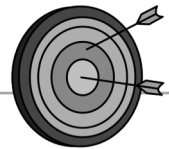
