Differentiate Countable and Uncountable Nouns

In English, **countable nouns** are things you can count, like "apples" or "dogs." They have both singular (one apple) and plural (two apples) forms. On the other hand, **uncountable nouns** are things you cannot count, like "milk" or "homework." These nouns do not have a plural form and often refer to things like liquids, materials, or abstract ideas.
