Apply Possessives in Context

Possessive pronouns are words that show who or what something belongs to. They tell us "whose" something is. Some common possessive pronouns are **my, mine, your, yours, his, her, hers, its, our, ours, their, and theirs**. These pronouns make sentences clearer and help avoid repetition.

Examples:

This is **my** book. (The book belongs to me.)

The red bike is **mine**. (The bike belongs to me.)
