Unknown Antonyms in Context

Antonyms are words with opposite meanings. In a sentence, certain words or phrases—such as **but**, **however**, **although**, and **yet**—signal a strong contrast between ideas before and after them. These contrast words help us understand the relationship between two parts of the sentence, which can be used to figure out the meaning of an unknown word.
