Syllable Division: V/CV and VC/V

Syllable division breaks words into parts for easier pronunciation. In **V/CV**, the vowel comes first with a long sound (e.g., ti-ger). In **VC/V**, the consonant comes first, and the vowel has a short sound (e.g., lem-on). This helps improve reading and pronunciation.

Read the words and then divide the words into syllables.
