Basic Use of Hyphens

Use a **hyphen** to:

- divide a word that does not fit in its entirety on a line. Split the word between syllables.
- Divide the parts of compound words.
- Join two or more words that function as a single adjective occurring before a noun
- Spell out the written form of fractions and compound numbers from twenty-one to ninety-nine
- With the prefixes all-, ex-, and self-, and with the suffix -elect
