Adjective Order in Simple Sentences

In English, it's common to use **multiple adjectives** to describe a single noun. However, adjectives must be arranged in a **specific order** based on established conventions. In some simple sentences, they typically follow this order:

Quantity > Quality > Size > Color > Noun

Example:

We say "the big blue car" rather than "the blue big car"
