Descriptive Details Using Prepositional Phrases

A **prepositional phrase** is a group of words consisting of a preposition, its object (a noun or pronoun), and any modifiers of the object. It can function like adjectives by providing details about a noun.

Example:

In the sentence "The boy in the yellow pants asked me to dance," "in the yellow pants" is a prepositional phrase that modifies "the boy."
