Interpret Poetic Devices

Poetic Devices are tools or techniques that poets use to create rhythm, enhance meaning, and evoke emotions in their work. There are some Figurative Languages:

Simile	A comparison using "like" or "as."
Metaphor	A direct comparison between two things without using "like" or "as."
Personification	Giving human qualities to non-human things.
Alliteration.	The repetition of the same initial sounds in a series of words.
Onomatopoeia	Words that imitate natural sounds.
