Verbs Be and Have in Multiple Tenses

The verbs "**Be**" and "**Have**" function in English both as main verbs expressing existence, identity, states, or possession ("I am happy", "She has a car") and as auxiliary verbs forming various tenses and voices ("I am working", "They have finished"), with each having specific forms across different tenses (am/is/are, was/were, been and have/has, had), making their mastery essential for accurately expressing time relationships and grammatical structures.
