Expression in Formal and Informal Contexts

Some words are fine for **informal conversations and discussions**. **Example:**

For **formal writing**, however, they should not be used.

👉 Informal example: *Her dad worked at a factory.*

👉 Formal example: *Her father worked at a factory.*

The word *dad* is used in a familiar way, which makes it sound informal. *Father* is a better word to use in formal writing.
