Use Participles

A **participle** is a verb form that can be used as an adjective or adverb. Adding participles to your story makes the writing more vivid and descriptive. If the noun **does the action** → use **present participle**. If the noun **receives the action** → use **past participle**.

Example:

Basic: *The boy climbed the tree.*

Expanded: *The boy, **smiling proudly**, climbed the tree.*
