Denotations and Connotations

Definition

Denotation is a word's literal, dictionary definition.

Connotation refers to the emotional associations or implied meanings that accompany a word beyond its literal definition.

Example

Word Pair	Denotation (Same)	Connotation (Different)
slim/skinny	thin	positive/negative
childlike/chil dish	resembling a child	innocent/immature
house/home	a dwelling building	neutral/warm, personal
cheap/econo mical	inexpensive	poor quality/good value
