Advanced Figurative Language

Definition

Advanced figurative language uses sophisticated techniques to create meaning beyond literal interpretations. These complex forms of expression create imagery, suggest associations, or draw subtle comparisons.

Example

Type	Example	Technique
Extended Metaphor	Life as a journey explored throughout a poem	Sustained comparison
Synecdoche	"All hands on deck" for all sailors	Part represents whole
Metonymy	"The Crown" for monarchy	Associated item represents concept
Personification	"Time marches on"	Human qualities given to abstract concept
Allusion	"His recovery was a phoenix rising from ashes"	Reference to cultural knowledge
