Definition

Choosing words from synonyms involves selecting the most appropriate word from similar options based on differences in meaning, connotation, formality, or context.

Example

Selection Criteria	Word Options	Difference
Intensity	happy/ecstatic/pleased	degree of emotion
Connotation	slim/skinny	positive vs. negative
Formality	begin/commence/start	formal vs. casual
Specificity	mistake/miscalculation	general vs. specific context
Precision	walk/stroll/stride	manner of movement
