Plot

Plot is the sequence of events in a story and how they connect. It typically follows a structure: **exposition** introduces characters and setting; **rising action** builds conflict; **climax** is the turning point of highest tension; **falling action** shows consequences; and **resolution** concludes the story. A well-developed plot has causality, where each event happens because of previous events, creating meaningful character development.

Read the following short story and answer the questions.

The Last Performance

Mia had practiced her violin solo for months, perfecting each note for the spring concert. As the youngest musician ever selected for a solo performance with the city's youth orchestra, she felt both honored and terrified.
