Use Context to Predict

Making predictions means guessing what will happen next in a story. We use clues from the text to help us make smart guesses.

Example:

If a character in the story is packing a bag, you might predict they are going on a trip.

Read the passages and make predictions.

1. What will happen next?

Ben was playing outside. He saw dark clouds in the sky. The wind began to blow, and it felt cold. Ben said, "I think something is going to happen." He ran inside and closed the door.

- A. It will rain.
- B. The sun will come out.
- C. Ben will go swimming.

2. What will Sally do next?

Sally was riding her bike when she saw a big puddle ahead. She looked around and noticed the road was wet. Sally slowed down.

- A. She will clean the puddle.
- B. She will ride across the puddle.
- C. She will stop her bike.
