CVCe Syllable

A CVCe syllable is a type of syllable that follows a specific pattern: **Consonant-Vowel-Consonant + e**. In this pattern, the final e is silent, but it changes the sound of the vowel in the syllable.

Example:

In the word cake, the e at the end is silent, and the vowel a sounds like "ay."
