Reflexive Pronouns

Reflexive pronouns are special pronouns that refer back to the subject of the sentence. They end in "-self" (singular) or "-selves" (plural). We use reflexive pronouns when the person or thing doing the action is also receiving the action.

Example:

I made this cake myself. (Refers back to "I")
