Simple Compound Sentences

A **compound sentence** is made up of two independent clauses. An independent clause has a subject and a predicate and can stand alone as a complete sentence. In a compound sentence, the two clauses are connected by a coordinating conjunction such as and, but, or or.

Example:

The dog barked, and the cat ran away.
